Gold Star Line has split its China- Philippine Express (CPX) into two weekly loops, one of which acting as a dedicated Hong-Kong-Manila feeder service (SMS) and the other one covering the other ports of the CPX, i.e. Inchon, Xingang, Dalian, Qingdao, Hong Kong and Xiamen (ICH). The CPX employed three ships turning in three weeks, the 1,118 teu AUSTRALIA STAR (now assigned to the SMS) and the 1,923 teu **PHILIPPINE STAR** and QINDGAO STAR (now assigned to the ICH). The split allows a more optimal ship use
