A foreign flag of convenience vessel has caused an oil spill at Glebe Island in Sydney. The clean up and containment operation was still under way at 5pm this afternoon.

The 2887 tonne Tongan flagged dry cargo ship TAVAKE OMA, built in 1984, reportedly developed a crack in a pipe between its ballast and fuel oil tanks in the early hours of the morning, leaking oil into the bay. The ship, registered to Cadem Shipping, is managed by Intercontinental Shipping.
