GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:

The Chinese-flag container-crane carrier **ZHEN HUA 5** (24,156 gross tonnage, built 1976) arrived to anchor outside Otago Harbour on the afternoon of 22nd February 2006 with three ready-erected container cranes highly visible on her decks. One crane, weighing 1,200 tonnes, was for Port Chalmers and the other two slightly arger cranes were bound for Valparaiso, Chile. The unusual ship is a converted bulk carrier and is one of a fleet of similar ships operated by Shangahi Zhen Hua Shipping Co. Ltd. of Shanghai and used to delivery new container cranes built in Shanghai to ports around the world.

Zhen Hua 5 had sailed from Hong Kong on 27th January 2006 for Otago.

Some berth preparation work was required after she berthed alongside on the evening of 25th February and it was 27th February before the new crane was unloaded.

Zhen Hua 5 sailed on 1st March 2006 with the other two container cranes bound for Valparaiso. Also on board were two rubber-tired straddle carriers destined for Los Angeles, her last stop on her way home.

Seen at Felixstowe in late April 2007 by David Hazell who wrote the following comment:

Whilst it has become the norm to the ships belonging to Shanghai Zhenhua Port Machinery Co Ltd (ZPMC) arriving in ports around the world with new cranes from China, in a reversal of roles, the **ZHEN HUA 5** arrived in Felixstowe yesterday, to collect a crane for transit back to China.

The crane was damaged by the Gunvor Maersk, on the 13th March 2006, after the vessel lost power and collided with it, whilst the crane was in the process of being commissioned.

Zhen Hua 5, was also the vessel that delivered the crane to Felixstowe from Shanghai, in November 2005.
